# World Youth Day Catechesis Theme Three: "Witnesses to Christ in the World"

Scripture Text: "Planted and built up in Jesus Christ, firm in the faith" (Col. 2:7))

## I. Introduction:

- a. <u>Thanks</u> for attending this last catechetical session here at WYD, Madrid, as we prepare to meet the Holy Father tomorrow evening in Vigil and Sunday Morning with the Celebration of Mass
  - 1. Once again, we pause on our pilgrimage to ask the Lord's blessings upon us and to conclude our reflection of fait
- II. Over the last three mornings, at the invitation of Pope Benedict, we have had the opportunity to accept a **threefold grace**:
  - i. On Thursday, we explored the gift of faith

Faith is a divine gift that allows us to enter into a personal, living relationship with Jesus...that allows us not simply to know about Jesus but to know Him intimately and personally.

- ii. Yesterday, we had the privilege to answer the same question Jesus posed to his disciples in the Gospel: Who do you say that I am?
  - 1. Jesus lies at the foundation of our faith and our lives
    - a. He is our Lord, Redeemer and Friend
- iii. Today, we will be challenged by Jesus to go forth in mission:
  - 1. To preach "Good News" to all the world as "witnesses" to Jesus
- III. In order to begin our reflection together, allow me to tell you a story that I read many years ago.
  - a. It is a story of a Christian preacher in the heart of Texas who challenged his people to live what they believe
    - i. At that time, there was a terrible drought in that region of Texas, somewhat similar to what many are now suffering in that same great state.
      - 1. Each Sunday, the preacher asked his people to pray for Rain
        - a. And they did pray, each Sunday at Service, with great conviction and fervor
        - b. Result: No rain
      - 2. As things got desperate, the preacher decided that it was time to storm heaven with prayers
        - a. They began one Sunday in Church with services and then moved into a great field for a day full:

- 1. Singing
- 2. Petitions
- 3. Prayer
- b. Result: No Rain
- 3. Amidst all the frustration, disappointment and even a bit of anger, the preacher turned to his congregation and asked:
  - a. Do you know why it did not rain?
    - i. Answer: It is your fault!
- 4. Congregation was astonished, speechless
  - a. Matriarch of the Congregation:
    - i. Preacher: you are being unfair
      - 1. We have been praying for months,
        - a. How is it our fault?
  - b. Answer came swiftly and without hesitation:
    - i. "Look at you, if you really believed, why did not one of you bring an umbrella!"
- b. While there are many reasons why God did not answer their prayers as they desired, the preacher's point is extremely important:
  - i. If we have faith in Jesus, then it will make a difference in our lives
    - 1. We will act based on what we believe
      - a. Speak
      - **b.** Act
      - **c.** See the world differently
  - ii. His Point: All who believe in Jesus are called to be = WITNESSES
    - 1. Witness = someone whose faith is put into action every moment of our lives
      - a. FAITH is not just left in the head or the heart but also moves our hands, our feet, our entire lives
    - 2. A witness is someone who lives life differently because of his/her faith in Christ....
  - iii. This has been the great call to all who follow Christ from the beginning of the Church:
    - 1. From Saint Paul, who was literally knocked off his horse, to leave his persecution of the Church to walk with the Lord as his Apostle to the Gentiles
    - 2. From the apostles, who gave their lives in witness to their Lord
    - 3. From the earliest generations of Christians, who willingly gave up their wealth, status, family and ultimately their lives to live their faith in a pagan, cruel and violent Empire

- 4. To our own age, where in the darkness of a prison cell in a Nazi concentration camp, a priest gave his life willingly for a Jewish man, St. Maximilliam Kolbe, and sang during the night before his death, in joyful anticipation of seeing His Lord,
- 5. So also to us is given a great mission to be witnesses to the Love and Power of Christ in our own lives, each moment of every day.

#### IV. So what is to be a witness to Jesus?

- a. While this question can be answered in many different way:
  - i. I prefer a simple definition:
    - 1. A Witness ="to manifest our faith in Jesus in word and action"
      - **a.** Unlike when we use the phrase "bear witness" in a courtroom to mean verbal testimony, to bear witness to Jesus means more than just words:

2. Words: Saint John Chrysostom and the cows

3. Actions: Saint Francis of Assisi:

"Use words if necessary"

4. Integrity: Saint Ignatius of Antioch

- 5. Against opposition: The pilgrims here at WYD who answered the taunts and threats of violence from protestors with songs and prayer
- **b.** Since faith establishes a personal relationship with Jesus, then to bear witness to him is <u>not</u> simply to convey knowledge about Jesus but <u>to help them to meet</u> Him as a real person
  - i. <u>Important Distinction we can never forget</u>: Knowing *about* Jesus *versus* Knowing *Jesus* 
    - 1. "Knowing about Jesus"
      - a. From our parents, our teachers and parish priests, we have learned who Jesus is, through classes, study and prayer
        - i. This is most important and the start of our journey of faith
      - b. However, many people know a lot about Jesus and do not believe in Him
        - i. We cannot simply know about Jesus
          - 1. Even the Devil can quote Scripture!
    - 2. "Knowing Jesus" is something totally different

- a. We can call this "a divine friendship" which we must establish with Jesus at the very depth of our hearts, minds and spirit.
- b. When we come not simply to know about Jesus but to know Jesus, then we will be changed forever!
- c. This change, this transformation = conversion or metanoia
  - 1. Met-noia: "To turn away our face/mind"
    - a. Reality of sin
    - b. Inability to heal ourselves
  - 2. In metanoia, we discover the gracious and generous love of God
- ii. Our Witness is to help the world NOT SIMPLY KNOW ABOUT JESUS but to KNOW HIM
- c. So I ask you, will there ever be a time when we will not witness to Jesus? NO
  - i. Is there ever a **moment** when we are not evangelizing? NO
  - ii. Is there ever a place where we are not evangelizing? NO
  - iii. Is there ever a **person** to whom we do not evangelize? NO
- d. Now Pope John Paul and Pope Benedict speak of Christian Witness in terms of a "New Evangelization": A new preaching of the Gospel
  - i. What can be new of something that has existed from the apostles?
  - ii. I believe with all my heart that **YOUR CONTRIBUTION** is what is truly New!
    - 1. New spirit
      - a. John Paul II challenged us to remember that the Church's mission is to live in such a way that shines out to others (Redemptoris Mission, 26):
    - 2. New energy
      - a. Revolution in Egypt
        - i. Pope is calling for a Revolution of Love...
      - b. "Faith is strengthened when it is given to others." (RM,
    - 3. New methods
      - a. Internet
        - i. Where is Jesus in Cyberspace?
          - 1. You are the ones to bring Him there
    - 4. New audience
  - iii. To SUM UP: Your Contribution and Mine:
    - 1. Is to bear witness to JESUS, one person at a time

- a. Talk is Cheap....it is Time for Action
- iv. AND WHEN WE REACH OUT TO THOSE AROUND US, ONE PERSON AT A TIME, we are going to tell them about **THE GOOD NEWS** that we have heard in Jesus

### 1. What is the GOOD NEWS?

- a. Life is worth living because God took a human life in Jesus
- b. Life is blessed because of Jesus' death and resurrection
  - i. Not just this life but eternal life
- c. Everyone can share in this blessing if they say yes to the Spirit's power to transform them
  - i. The **Spirit is the one who can give** these blessings to you and me
- 2. **GOOD NEWS DOES NOT END THERE**: All the saints before us have learned the same lesson:
  - a. As Father Robert Barron says so beautifully in his teachings, we will bear witness to the fact that MY LIFE IS NOT ABOUT ME.
    - i. Jesus: "He who loses his life will save it; he who clings to his life will lose it"
      - 1. If the Spirit is DIVINE LOVE, then my life is all about love....giving myself away to others
  - b. For the world, this idea is crazy:
    - i. The most important word in the English language is "**ME**":
      - 1. And as long as I have what I need, that is all that matters
    - ii. The world will tempt you:
      - 1. It is a doggy-dog world: and if you have to lie, cheat or step on the next person, that is OK
      - 2. What about the poor, sick, elderly, unemployed?
        - a. Tough Luck to them....you worry about #One = you.
  - c. <u>COMMUNITY/FAMILY</u> we form is **as important** as you and I as persons
    - i. Today, here in **Madrid: we say that the most important word is "us" in Christ**
    - ii. It is **about "us"** in Christ

- V. <u>It is not easy to bear witness to Jesus: Three Important Lessons to help keep us on track:</u>
  - a. First Lesson: Grandma used to say: "You cannot give what you do not have"
    - i. Variation: "You cannot share who you do not know"!
      - 1. Your Personal relationship with the Lord Jesus is the <u>most</u> important relationship you will ever have
        - a. Nurture this relationship first and foremost by prayer
    - ii. I am often asked: How can I pray?
      - 1. **Prayer**: is **Communication** with God (at its most basic)
        - a. Makes Sense: To spend time with the God whom we love
          - i. As communication, it is a two way street
            - 1. Speaking is as important as listening
            - 2. <u>Listening</u> is an art that needs to be learned
      - 2. Prayer is both Personal and Communal
        - a. <u>Personal</u>: Challenge is to make the time
        - b. Communal: Challenge is to discern the need
          - i. Why do I have to go to Church to pray?
            - 1. One great gift comes only when we are together: **EUCHARIST**
      - 3. Eucharist: GREATEST SACRAMENT OF JESUS' LOVE
        - a. Jesus come to us in His Body and Blood, soul and divinity
          - i. His Body broken for us...His Blood poured out for us
        - b. When we receive this great sacrament of Love, **we are** changed:
          - i. Acknowledge our sins and ask for forgiveness (Penitential Rite)
          - ii. The desire to know Him more deeply: (Liturgy of the Word)
          - iii. <u>Unites us together as a family of faith around</u> one altar (Sacrifice)
          - iv. The burning desire to bring others to Jesus
      - iii. RESULT: Through prayer, we can gradually grow in Holiness:
        - 1. Meaning of Holiness:
          - a. Catechism's understanding:
            - i. Model of all holiness is the Lord Jesus

- ii. Perfection of charity is holiness of life (CCC, 1709)
- b. Holiness = (wholeness) Right Relationship with
  - God
  - ii. My neighbor
  - iii. Myself
- b. **Second Lesson**: "Witness is all about Ordinary Life"
  - i. Manifest that faith to others through the actions of my personal life:
    - 1. Story of Elijah
      - a. God came in the breeze: In the ordinary!
  - ii. Manifest that faith to others through the actions of my community:
    - 1. Grandma also use to say: Show me your friends and I will tell you the type of person that you are:
      - a. And so I ask you:
        - i. Are your friends
          - 1. Christ-centered?
          - 2. Prayerful?
          - 3. Welcoming?
          - 4. Generous?
          - 5. Just?
      - b. If they are, you are blessed
        - i. If not, it is time for new friends
- c. Third Lesson: To bear witness to Christ demands sacrifice, even suffering
  - i. It is easy to get <u>discouraged</u> in our world...seem to be more problems than solutions
    - 1. **Temptation**: is to turn away and give up even trying to change things
      - a. My suspicion is that we have all been tempted to do just that
  - ii. Truth: Change is possible but never easy
    - 1. We have to keep our eyes fixed on the goal that we wish to achieve and be prepared to struggle and sacrifice for what we believe in
  - iii. The theme of our time together, Col. 2:7 was written by Saint Paul while he was in prison
    - 1. On the surface, he had every reason to give up

- a. But he did not....because He knew that Jesus would never abandon him
- b. He wrote the letter to assure the Colossians in their faith!
- c. Why?
  - i. His believed that his victory was assured
  - ii. And so is yours and mine in Christ!

## VI. Conclusion

- a. I do not know whether it rained in that small town in Texas...
  - i. But I have every confidence that there was a run on selling umbrellas
    - 1. Because believing in Jesus should make a real difference in your life and mine
  - ii. As we end our catechesis, let us remember the words of Saint Paul to Timothy (2Tim. 2:11):
    - 1. "If we have died with Him, we shall also reign with him, and if we endure, we shall also reign with Him."
      - a. It is time for some reigning!
