STREAM

This September, each student from grades one through eight will have new trapezoidal, ergonomic desks in their classrooms that can be arranged into multiple configurations to promote collaborative learning activities and enhance STREAM and conventional lessons.

Each student from kindergarten through grade eight has access to the school's premier STREAM (Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, Math)

Lab. Made possible through an Embassy Grant, the lab will feature electric wiring beneath a granite tile floor, Chromebooks, a flat-screen TV, a SMART Wall, science equipment, software, cooperative learning tables and many other technological resources.

Additional offerings include Pre-K for All; Samsung tablets in grades seven and eight; Apple iPads for first and second grades; SMART Boards; Title I and SETTS services; ELL; Speech; Spanish in grades four through eight; Renowned Gospel Choir and before- and after-school programs.

It is the mission of Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Academy to nurture, engage and educate students in their commitment to God, as lifelong learners, and as contributors to society, within the richly diverse community of Corona.

The academy curriculum follows the diocesan religion curriculum, and other subjects are aligned with the New York State Common Core Standards, New York State Social Studies Frameworks, the International Standards for Technology in Education, and New York State Standards for Science and the Arts. Students learn all of these things in a variety of ways, show what they know through tests and performance, and view all of it through the lens of the Catholic faith.

Students participate in the standardized TerraNova tests in grades three through eight, and fourth, sixth and eighth graders participate in the New York State testing program.

The information from these tests ensures that students are being taught what they are expected to know and assists the principal and faculty in developing

instruction that meets students' needs.

Some of the special programs at the academy include a full religion program, Super Kids, STREAM, Catholic Math League, Music and Artists in Residence.

Information technologies are infused into the entire curriculum. Students do internet research and prepare and present videos and other presentations. They participate in curriculum-related webinars and Google Hangouts. SMART Boards and their interactive programs are available in every room, and the academy has laptops, Chrome Books and tablets available for use by every student, and a computer lab equipped with desktops and printers.

Early childhood classes are taught by caring, energetic, well-qualified teachers, supported by bilingual aides. Every day, they pray and learn to grow closer to Jesus, Mary and the Church.

Although it often looks as if they are "just playing," the learning never stops. Construction materials and puzzles develop problem-solving skills and lay the foundation for mathematical thinking and a "maker" mindset.
